	Fast And Pray	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Hear Gods' heart (for the church and the community). 2. Grow a burden for the community.
Draw a program Set an Agenda	Importance of an Agenda	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The agenda sets the tone and direction for the planning meeting. 2. Keeps the planning meeting in focus and on track. 3. Ensures the main points are discussed and the goal of the planning meeting is achieved. 4. It allows appropriate time for discussion of each item on the agenda.
Set a suitable date, time and venue for the meeting		<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The date should be determined well in advance. 2. The venue chosen should be adequate to meet the needs for the planning meeting. 3. Ideally the venue should be away from normal environment so as to avoid disturbances.
Duration	Set down a program	You will need at least 6 hours with breaks in between for lunch and tea.
Meeting Attendees	Decide who you will invite and how many	It's common courtesy and a good ethic to send out personal invites and letters to those attending the meeting – stating the venue, time, nature of the meeting and what is expected of each delegate. This will ensure delegates are well prepared ahead of time for the planning meeting. Do not invite too many people as this will affect the lines of communication.

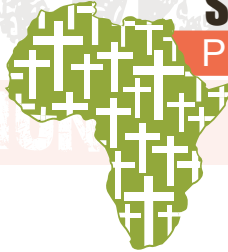
